MUTINY FC: WE ARE OFF AND RUNNING !!

On May 31, 2009, as the dust settled in the parking lot, and on one of the final days of the Spring Soccer Season, an all out assault on competitive soccer in North Texas broke out. The Wylie Youth Soccer Association (WYSA) expanded its current youth soccer program and established a competitive soccer club for children in the City of Wylie and the surrounding communities. Mutiny FC - www.WylieMutinyFC.com - challenges what has come to be expected in the North Texas soccer community by providing an affordable competitive soccer option that includes professional coaching, skills training, coaching education, local practice facilities and technical development programs for children ages 6 thru 19. Competitive soccer will never be the same.

"We wanted to provide a quality competitive soccer program that is affordable to our community," said Shirley Clark, VP of Communications for WYSA. "All of our coaches and program managers are volunteers. This keeps our costs down ... We all do this for the passion of teaching the game of soccer ... The Mutiny FC program is managed by former professional players, college coaches, players and energetic parents. "I got an email requesting help and I thought, why not? I wanted to help build a great program for my kids to participate in," said Jason Adams, the new WYSA Education Director. "I have been involved in sports and sports management my entire life. This is my opportunity to give something back." Giving back they are! The coaches and volunteers have worked over the last twelve months to develop the club's structure, evaluate coaches and market the new program internally within WYSA and externally throughout the community.

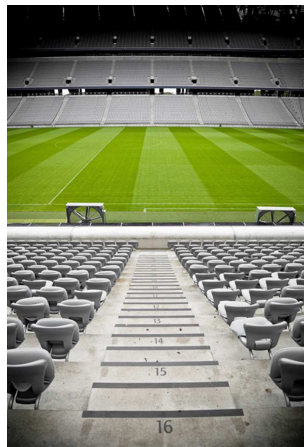

Parents are encouraged to participate in the sessions and enjoy the Academy experience. This participation allows individuals to learn more about Academy Soccer or possibly coaching a team in the future. INTRODUCING—TODD BRUNSKILL—DIRECTOR OF COACHING

Mutiny FC is excited to introduce Todd Brunskill as our Director of Coaching. Todd will oversee the Mutiny coaches and the WYSA competitive soccer program.



Todd is a product of the Garland area and a current Wylie resident. Todd grew up playing in GSA and the NDCC classic league. Todd has held a “C” USSF National license since 1996. His experience in coaching select soccer in the Dallas area includes boys and girls’ teams at the Classic level, Arlington select and Plano leagues since 1985, during this time he has been responsible for the development of over 200 players, many of which went on to play in college. He has also coached at the semi-professional level in the USISL serving as both a head coach and player coach for the Addison Arrows, Texas Stampede and Texas Arsenal. Todd coached the Dallas Alliance and the Sting select women teams that reached the National Championship final four three times. He has served as an OPD coach for several years with North Texas, as well as instructed coaching courses for various license levels.

Todd began his professional career with the Dallas Americans in 1985. His professional/semi-professional playing experience includes 1 year in USL with the Dallas Americans and 7 years in the USISL. While playing in the USISL was named to the all star team 4 times, Goalkeeper of the Year in 1988, 1987 championship series defensive MVP, and named defensive player of the game over 25 times and defensive player of the week over 10 times during his career. Todd also played for the first USISL team which was the Garland Genesis.

Todd played college soccer at Chapman University and Hardin Simmons from 1980 to 1984, while at Chapman he set a school record for most shutouts in a season which still stands today. He also played at North Garland during which time he was named all city twice and all district his senior year.

Todd has been married to his wife Pam for over 24 years, they met playing soccer. Their three children, Kasey, Meaghan and Madison are also soccer players as well.

Mutiny FC-Training Programs: Skills, Drills, Thrills !!

One of the core philosophies of Mutiny FC is the introduction of individual development, technical skills and training programs for all of our players. These programs have been developed to work with all ages of Mutiny players including our Little Mutineer’s (age 6 thru 8), Mutiny Training Academy (Age 9 & 10) and Mutiny Competitive Teams (Age 11 thru 19). These training programs are geared towards providing Basic, Intermediate and Advanced skills that challenge each player and help them build the technical foundation and confidence needed to succeed at the highest levels.

Various programs have been introduced that focus on technical areas like foot skills and ball handling, core conditioning and functional positional training. Other programs focus on more specific topics like Small-Sided Tactics, Goalkeeper Training and Team Formation & Positioning. Some High School age players within Mutiny are introduced to College Recruiting and Scholarship processes, Leadership and Mentoring opportunities. Mutiny has programs available that benefit all players and help towards their goals.

Mutiny has partnered with Ferdie’s Soccer Magic to offer basic skills training and foot skills for our players. These skills programs are included in the annual club cost and are available to all Mutiny Players. Our goal; is to have players that are highly skilled and understand the game of soccer. 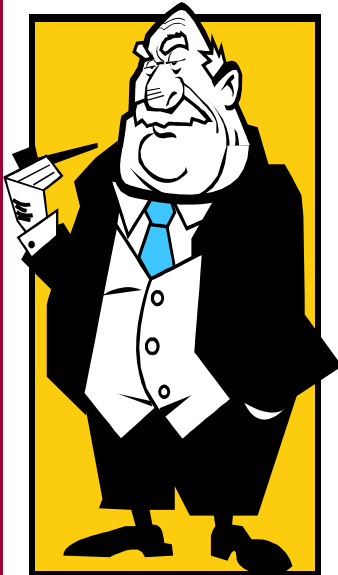

The Mutiny FC philosophy is based on providing an affordable club in North Texas for competitive soccer that focuses on long-term player development and training. Our technical foundation is introduced in our Mutiny Training Academy and expanded to an intermediate and advanced level in our Competitive teams. All teams within Mutiny FC train under a structured program with similar skills, tactics and methods. Our club is associated with the Wylie Youth Soccer Association and currently has teams participating in Competitive and Academy Leagues within North Texas Soccer. Mutiny FC has started working closely with NCAA and NAIA college coaches, college soccer programs and existing collegiate athletes to initiate and prepare our players for the next phase of their lives after club soccer. All Mutiny FC coaches are certified at a National "D" License Level or above, and are evaluated and reviewed yearly on knowledge and performance. Coaching Education, Training, Evaluation and Advancement Programs are managed by the clubs Director of Coaching – Todd Brunskill. As Mutiny's DOC Coach Brunskill certifies that all coaches within the club are trained and performing up to the level of their capabilities.
